Crafty Kangaroos

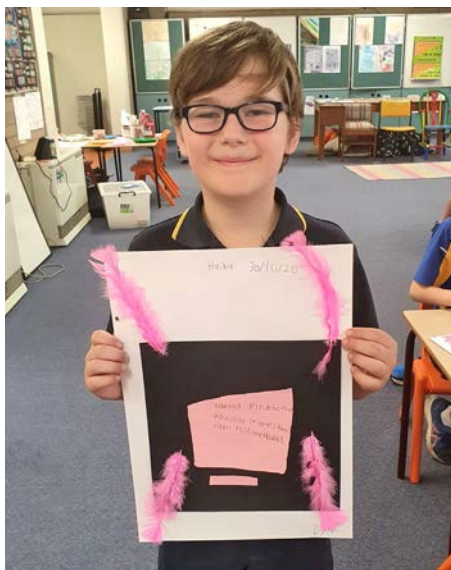
Kangaroo students worked on some very creative posters in class on Tuesday to present their research on the ocean!

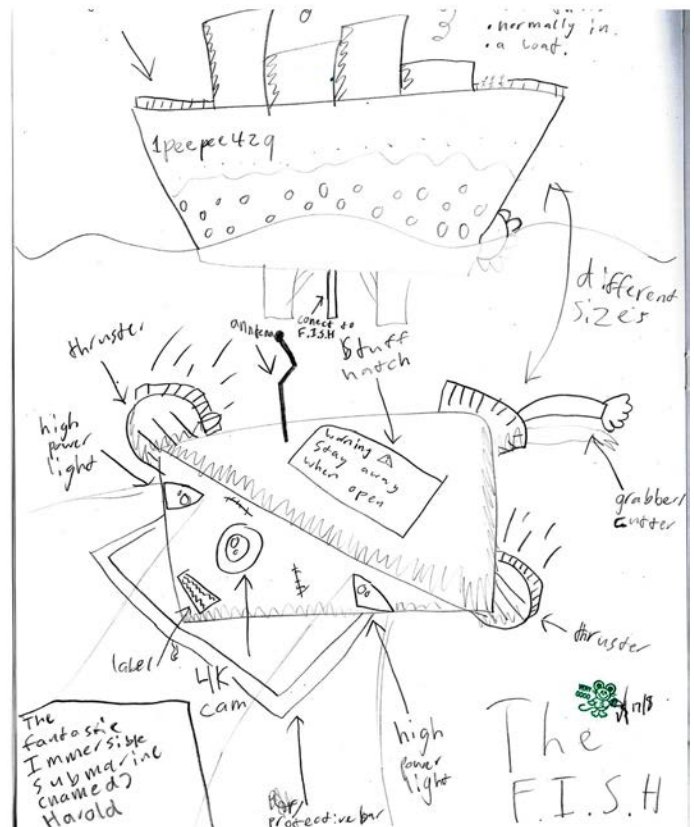


Ryan comes out on top of National Science Week competition
