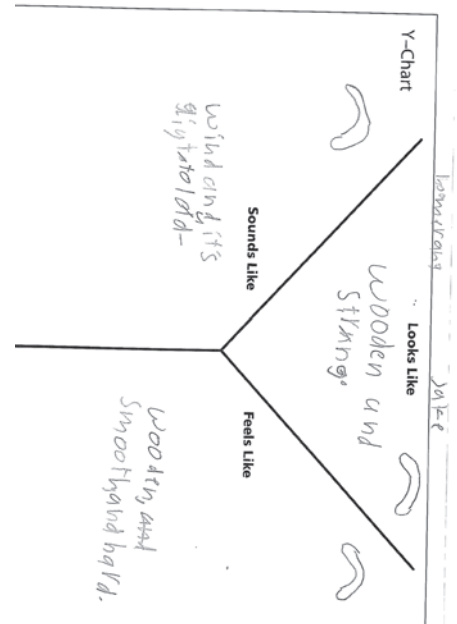
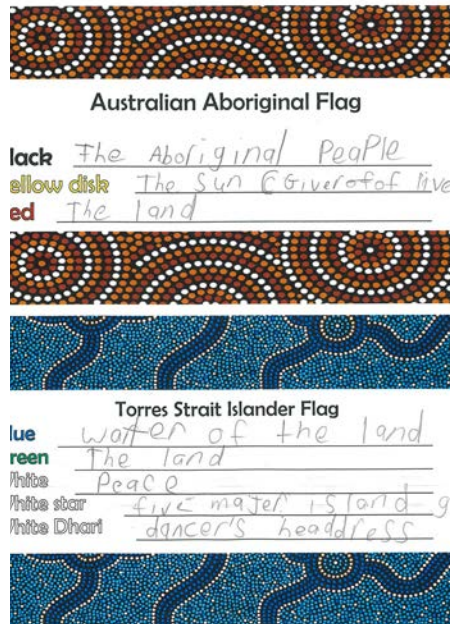
Fun Day preparations

A Reflective Lens on Environmental Photography Workshop

With ecologist & environmental photographer Alison Pouliot

Photographic images shape perceptions and the ways in which we understand the environment. This online workshop explores a wide range of environmental themes through an illustrated seminar and interactive critique of participant's images. It goes beyond the literal representations of 'nature photography' to address the thought processes behind creating compelling and meaningful images and visual stories.

The workshop assists participants to improve the impact and interpretative power their images. In particular, it explores the visual tensions between aesthetics, ecology and conservation. It is suitable for people with all levels of environmental knowledge and photographic skill.

UNPRECEDENTED is a paste-up photography exhibition for young photographers documenting your 2020. Amongst all the bad news, there have been many examples of resilience and hope. Submit a photograph that sums up your 2020.

A collection of photographs will be exhibited in an outdoor gallery in Albury during December and January. But get in quick! **The deadline for submissions is Friday 20 November.**

TIPS

- Photos should reflect on your year in 2020 – whether it's reflecting on your experience during the bushfires, or in lockdown or remote learning, or being able to get back together with friends now things are easing and your hopes for the future.
- The higher quality the image the better! Please make sure the photo is at least 1MB and up to 5MB in size, and at a minimum 200DPI (300 is better!)
- A single bold image will print up better than an image with lots of elements and complexity.
- Boost your contrast and saturation to make your photo really stand out when printed (black and white pictures are also good).
- Keep it PG and relevant – images featuring adult content will not be exhibited.
