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Stage 3 in 3D

New cleaning crew

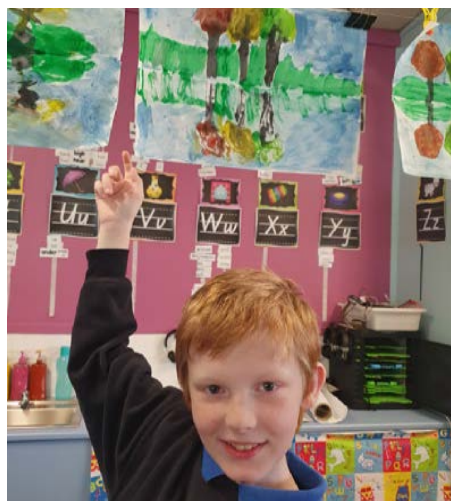
Mrs Creamer has had lots of wonderful students helping her clean up fallen leaves in the playground before school each day this week.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL

- Physical distancing will no longer be required of students. They will, however, be encouraged to wash and disinfect hands frequently.
- Parents are carers are asked not to enter the school site unless absolutely necessary (e.g. Emergency situation)
- Only students who are unwell or have chronic health conditions are excused from on-site learning. These exceptions must be supported by a medical certificate.
