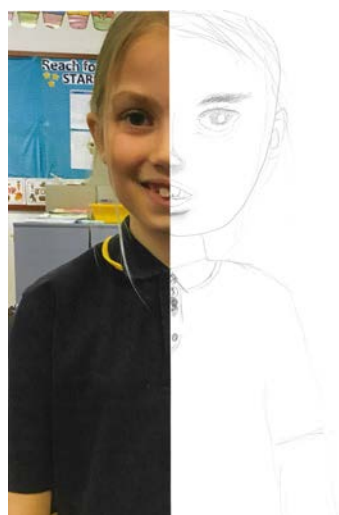


Love of literacy in Echidna class
