Bilby students had a great time in their sport session on Tuesday when, as part of their Dojo reward system, students took turns running the class!



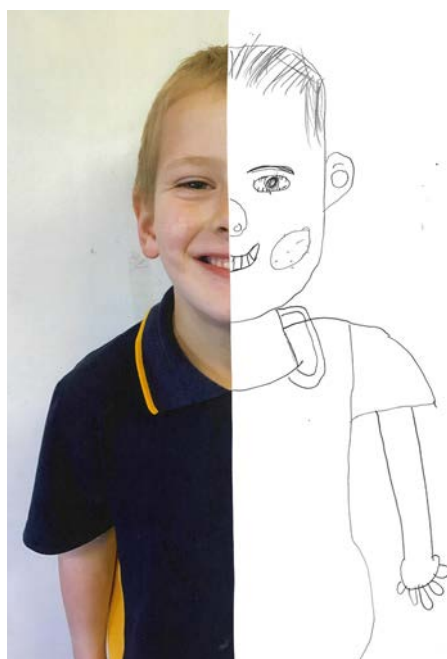
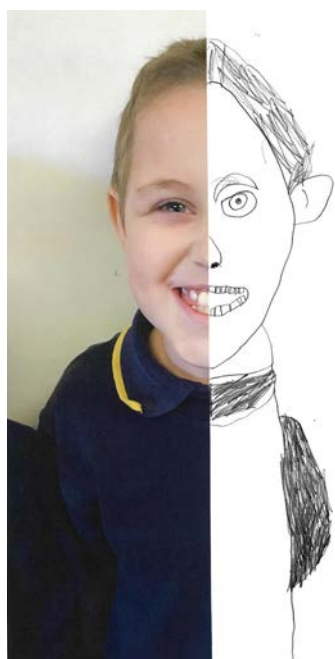


Kindergarten get their hands dirty

NSW Department of Education Before and After School Care Reform Grant

Work is well underway on the installation of our new school kitchen facilities in K Block. The classroom required modifications to satisfy standard eligibility regulations for an OSHC service. Appliances include oven, cooktop, range hood and refrigerator. Benches, under cupboards, sink and hot/cold water, tiling, painting and new vinyl flooring are new additions to the kitchen facility. Outdoor lighting has been provided for security purposes. Corowa Public School acknowledges the project is supported by an Infrastructure Fund Grant of \$30,000 provided by the NSW Department of Education.

Students and staff look forward to utilising the school kitchen connecting our school vegetable garden with cooking classes through teaching and learning in 2021.

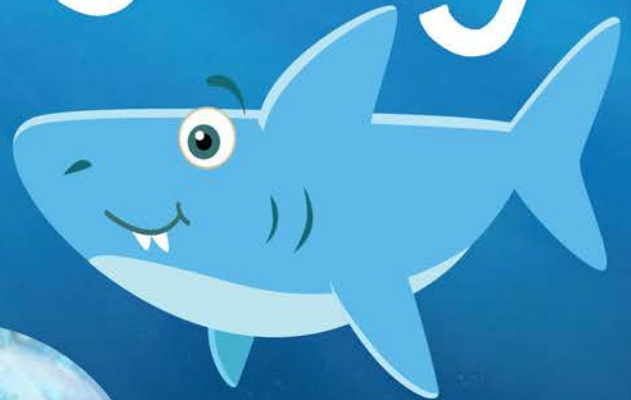

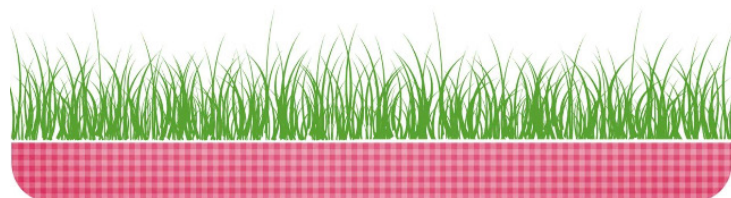
